

## General Discussion Questions on Rebellion

### **What motivates characters to rebel?**

Are they driven by personal values, social injustice, revenge, or desperation?

### **Is rebellion portrayed as heroic or dangerous in the work? Why?**

Does the author seem to support the rebel or criticize them?

### **How does rebellion affect the individual versus society in the text?**

What are the personal costs of standing up against the status quo?

### **Is the rebellion successful? If so, at what cost? If not, why does it fail?**

What does this outcome suggest about resistance and power?

### **How does the setting or society in the novel encourage or suppress rebellion?**

Are there laws, traditions, or power structures that provoke defiance?

### **What role does fear play in maintaining control—and in sparking rebellion?**

Are there examples of fear being used as a weapon by both rebels and oppressors?

### **What literary techniques does the author use to portray rebellion?**

Consider symbolism, point of view, tone, and character development.
